## **QUICK TIPS ON BRITISH ETIQUETTE & PROTOCOL**

**DO** greet Britons by shaking hands. The grip may be weaker than what is considered normal in the U.S. Return the grip that you are given as a sign of respect.

**DON'T** slap someone's back or touch them, as Britons generally do not display affection in public. Hugging, kissing and touching should be reserved for family members and very close friends.

**DO** prepare a gift if you have been invited to someone's home for a dinner, party or gathering. This represents the guest's appreciation for the host's hospitality.

**DON'T** ask personal questions, especially "Where are you from?" This can be seen as an attempt to define the recipient's social class and is seen as an intrusion.

**DO** introduce yourself with your full name, and expect to be called by your title and last name, as this is seen as a sign of respect. The use of first names in a business setting is rare but is becoming more common.
